Workshop 'Social Innovation for System-Level Change'

Objectives:

What does it take to turn good ideas into lasting change? For Europe, the answer may lie in the slow but steady rise of social innovation. Once considered niche, it is now at the heart of how the EU hopes to tackle challenges that markets and governments have struggled to solve alone, from social inclusion to climate resilience.

This workshop will focus on system-level change. The German case will open the conversation, with Judith Terstriep and Norbert Kunz showing how two decades of experimentation have reshaped welfare, community services and financial models for social enterprises. Their story underlines that resilience requires not just one-off projects, but structures that endure.

The second half of the workshop will shift from reflection to action. Together with Managing Authorities, Implementing Bodies, and National Competence Centres, the Community of Practice will co-design the 2026 work programme, addressing financial and philanthropic strategies to support societal change, proposing ways to embed social rights in European frameworks, discussing how to scale impact to advance the ESF+ SI Priority, and reimagining the role of the social economy.

The goal is to reinforce collaboration among cross-sectoral CoP SI members – public, private, and social – to strengthen Europe's social innovation ecosystem. If successful, the workshop could mark a decisive step in moving from scattered experiments to systemic transformation.
